

I completed my graduate training in the NYU clinical psychology program under Bernie Kalinkowitz, PhD. The program at that time was training in a classical psycho-dynamic model.

After completing my internship, I went on to a position in the adult inpatient psychiatry service of Kings County Hospital Center, in central Brooklyn. In that setting I spent ten years in the inpatient service, moving up to a supervisory position and working from the psycho-dynamic model which I was trained in both with individuals and groups.

I then was promoted to a senior position in the Child and Adolescent OPD Psychiatry service. I worked there with children in the nineteen eighties and the nineties and I was able to attend three years of post-graduate training in structural family therapy under the tutelage of Salvador Minuchin. Much of my work became focused on providing family therapy and for many of those years there was a significant segment of the population were foster children and their families.

I then moved to the inpatient Child and Adolescent Service where I continued to work and supervise psychologists in family based interventions.

During the course of my career I became interested in the issues of grief and mourning. In the past fifteen years I focused on PTSD issues of inpatients and those who were in the day hospital program..
