## NEFESH INTERNATIONAL 2024 CALL FOR POSTERS

---

The NEFESH International Conference is now accepting submissions for its poster session, scheduled as part of the 27th Annual Conference. The conference will take place from Wednesday evening, December 18, through Sunday, December 22, 2024, at the Sheraton Parsippany in New Jersey.

### Eligibility

All graduate students, doctoral candidates, residents or fellows are eligible to submit. The individual submitting the poster must be an author on the poster but does not have to be first author.

### Submission Protocol

To submit an abstract, send an email to [cdarrison@NEFESHinternational.org](mailto:cdarrison@NEFESHinternational.org) no later than November 17, 2024, with the following information:

1. Name of presenting author
2. Level of training of the presenting author: i.e., year in graduate school
3. Institution/Program
4. A list of all co-authors and their institutional affiliations
5. Poster title
6. An abstract relating to the poster content (maximum of 250 words). Poster related to original research findings should include briefly relevant background information, methods, results, and conclusions.
7. Please note that abstract submissions should be no longer than 1 page, font size 12, Times New Roman font, attached to the email as a Word document.

Submitted abstracts will be peer reviewed and the submitting author will be notified if accepted for the Poster Session. All presenting authors must be available for the Poster Session on Sunday, December 22, 2024.

### Categories

Posters typically present new research findings or a case study. Occasionally, a focused literature review may be suitable.

## Research Award

This year, the winner of the inaugural NEFESH Poster Research Award will receive an honorarium of \$500. Additional honorable mention awards of \$250 may be given at the discretion of our Awards Judging Panel.

## Guidelines for Posters

- Posters should be as self-explanatory as possible
- Place the title, author(s), and institutional affiliations at the top of the poster
- Use simple charts, graphs, drawings, and pictures where possible
- Use less words, not more
- Captions and labels should be brief and clear

## Guidelines for Original Research Posters

- Posters must report only the findings of original research or clinical data, no advertising or product identification by brand name is allowed.
- You can submit a poster previously submitted for another Poster Session within the past year.
- If any of the work in this poster was prepared with commercial support, a statement “Supported by funding from (name of company)” must be clearly displayed in block letters in the lower left corner of the poster.
- Research with human or animal subjects must have been approved by the appropriate review boards of your institution or governing body.
- Information regarding unapproved uses of approved products or investigational uses of unapproved products must be clearly presented with the following statement included on the poster: “The following information concerns a use that has not been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.”

## Guidelines for Case Report Posters

- The material should be selected for educational value: What can we learn from this case report?
- The material must disguise all identifying patient information.
